Kay Mauser was a. veteran with Windsor Writers when Harry and Barbara Zirkelbach moved to Windsor Gardens a dozen years ago. I joined the Writers immediately, met her and the other ten members.

The group had seldom been more than ten members; but the quality and quantity of what they did was staggering.

They had created Windsor World, and for years published the 16 page monthly. It was distributed free to every Unit in Windsor Gardens, narrating the goings-on in Windsor Gardens, and including a generous number of articles members had written. And more; these members were responsible for the Sale of all ads, preparation of each edition, the printing and distribution — -everything — year after year.

And no writer was ever paid.

Until that day when Kay and others arranged for two pages in Windsor Life each month, and the final edition of Windsor World.

Small in stature, Kay remained a giant to her friends in all activities.

At Sunday Catholic Mass at Centerpoint, it was Kay who greeted all parishioners, inquiring if they wished Communion, adding their host to the chaise for Father Tom or other celebrant, to consecrate and distribute. In addiction she made sure you had a Mass booklet.

Kindness, generosity, personality, friendship exuded from her on every occasion, even when you were wrong.
